Work Based Learning in the CTE

Every year Lincoln High School's Career and Technical Educational programs incorporate Work Based Learning into their curriculum. WBL helps students obtain knowledge regarding different jobs within a career field. Instructors take students on field trips, have speakers visit the classroom from trade schools, invite former students working in the field to come back and speak about their experiences, and give externships to students that want to pursue a possible career in a specific field.

Ron Maher ASE Certified Master Mechanic, instructor of the Automotive MLR program has speakers come in from UNOH, OTC, UTI, Lincoln College & other institutions. Field trip locations include, Henry Ford, The Ford Rouge Plant, AutoRama, & MCC Auto Steam Days.

Jamie Lipiec RDH, BSDH, the instructor of the Dental Assistant program visited Detroit Mercy Dental, Olson Dental Labs, and also provided a dental day at Kennedy Early Childhood. Guest speakers and former students also present frequently in her classroom.

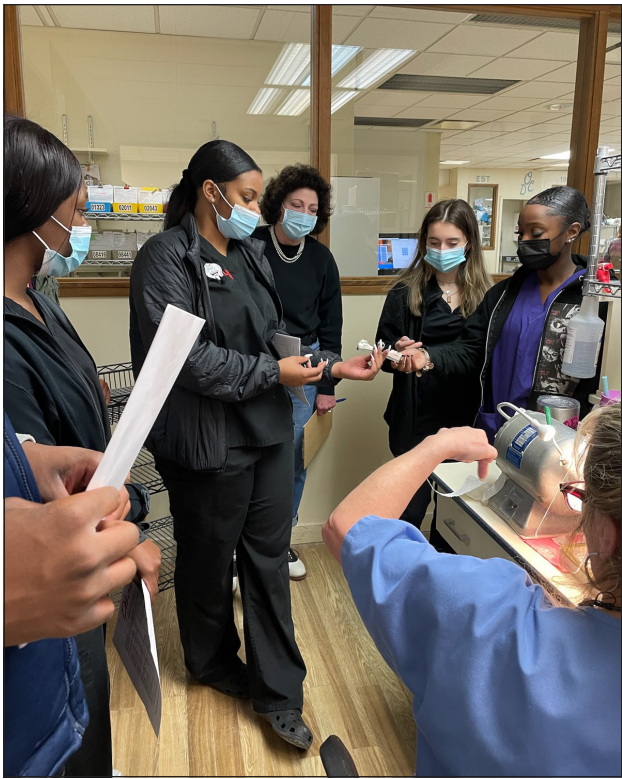

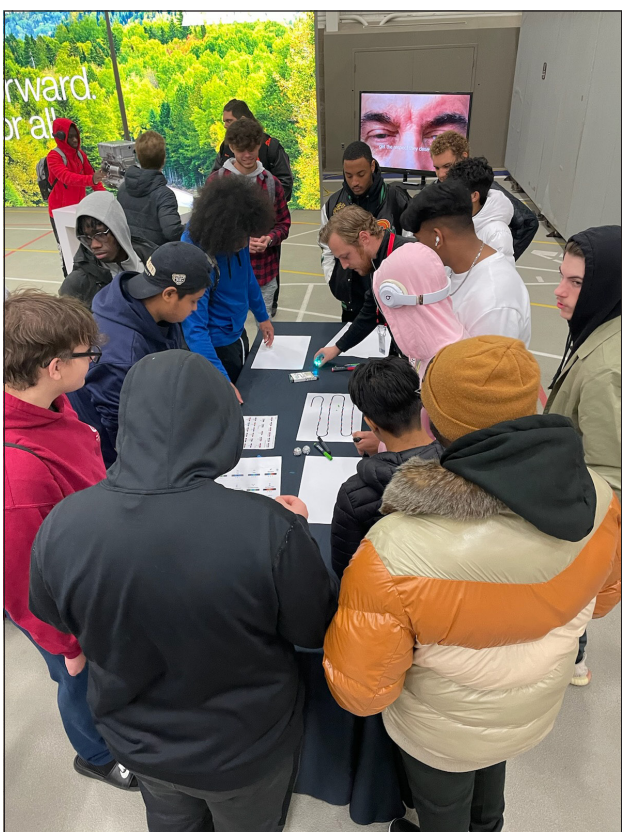

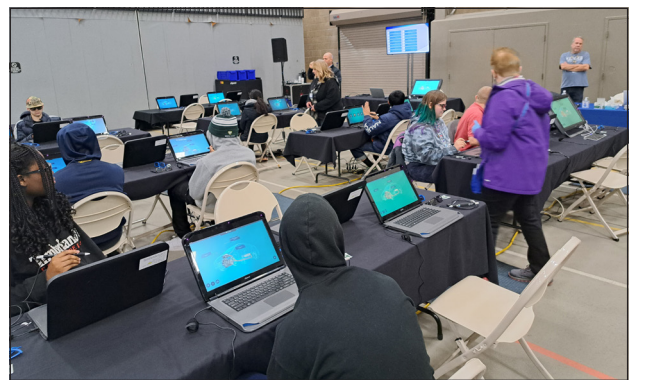
